& celery salad, marble cake with chocolate sauce.


FRIDAY: Burger in a bun with relish and chipped potatoes, Tuscan bean butternut

#### Dear Sir/ Madam

This letter concerns parking issues in the area at the end of Garfield Road, at the beginning and end of the school day.

Over the last few weeks, there have been complaints from both residents in Garfield Road and other parents, reference the manner of driving and parking of vehicles when children are both dropped off to start school in the morning and are collected again in the afternoon.

These complaints cover issues such as, damage to residents' vehicles caused by vehicles manoeuvring in Garfield Road and near misses as children walk home from the school. There is also the issue of illegal parking in Garfield Road.

As you are aware, the area at the end of Garfield Road where children exit the school is a dead end, very narrow and has double yellow lines on one side. It is not a dedicated parking or dropping off point. Parking is on one side of the road only and is used by residents who live in the road.

I have attended the road on numerous occasions and witnessed my self the chaos and complete disregard for safety of others in this area of the road and the near misses as cars try and pass each other in such a narrow space.

Therefore, I am writing this letter to ask all parents or guardians who attend the school at the relevant times to park elsewhere and walk to the school to collect their child. A police officer will be in the area as often as possible in the future and will deal with any traffic infringements in the most stringent manner he feels appropriate. This may be the issuing of fixed penalty tickets or in extreme cases, reporting drivers for summons. I hope it will not get to the point of legal action and this situation stops immediately.

I ask the above for both the safety of your children and the comfort of residents in the area.
