What a pleasure it was to read the recent County Press article that highlighted so many positives from the recent HMI report (HMI are the people that Ofsted use to inspect their inspectors). This is the first Ofsted report that I have ever seen that has described teachers' "Exceptional Skill" and described other teaching as "very effective in driving pupils' progress."

In his verbal feedback at the end of the inspection Paul Scott (HMI) said "behaviour throughout the school is very good", and you can be sure that words like that are used extremely carefully by inspectors and only when they are confident that they have the evidence to justify it.

As I mentioned in the post-Ofsted meeting we had in October, we needed to reverse the domino effect, and I believe the feedback from the HMI clearly shows that, together, we have already significantly improved Learning & Teaching and Behaviour & Safety and are ...




We are delighted to be able to offer you a DVD of The Stable Story for just £3. Please ask at the school office, payment with orders please. Thank you.

We will always try our best to keep the school open if it is safe to do so. We need to consider all aspects, from the condition of the school grounds, to staff availability due to unsafe travelling.



The council website has a page dedicated to the status of schools: whether they are open or closed, and in past years they have updated the page with additional guidance to parents.

You can assume that the school will be open unless the council have declared otherwise

The council also informs Isle of Wight Radio (FM 107) which always does its best to keep everyone informed, so it is worth tuning in to hear a regular update.

I will do my best to make a decision as early as possible in order to help you make any necessary plans.

Please do not phone the school to find out if the school is open or closed, as it is impossible for us to talk individually to 200 or so families.
