Unfortunately, the Diocesan Director of Education has had to change the date that he is able to visit Shanklin, so we have had to reschedule "The Ofsted Report & The Way Forward" meeting for Parents and Carers. The new date is Thursday 27th September.

Together, we will address issues raised by the Ofsted report; outline the steps that have already been taken to improve the school, and share with you the plans we have to ensure that the school continues to improve rapidly, significantly and sustainably into the future.

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Shanklin CE Primary School,

In a week that the school's Ofsted report is published (which is, frankly... damning), it may come as a surprise to some people, that I should feel so completely positive and confident about the future for Shanklin CE Primary School. My confidence comes from what I have seen in these first two weeks of term - a calm, purposeful and work-focussed atmosphere is the norm throughout the school with effective learning at the forefront.

There were some significant changes introduced by Ms Hodgson, Miss Downer and the team throughout last year, some of which had insufficient time to bear their full fruit before the inspection. I have been fortunate to inherit a team of teachers and support staff who unquestionably have the best interests of the children at heart, and who are not only willing, but keen to take on new ideas in order to move the school forward.

The positive way in which the children have embraced the new school rules and the kindness of the older children going out of their way to show care to the younger ones is really impressive! We have welcomed a number of school inspectors and advisors over the last week, every one of whom has given us very encouraging and positive feedback, and we are working closely with the Local Authority and the Diocese to ensure an effective action plan is in place to improve every aspect of the school. Some of these we can (and have) put in place quickly, others - such as "progress in learning over time" - will take a while to show their full effects.

The contribution that families make to children's learning is absolutely crucial too, and I am looking to foster open, approachable and strongly supportive relationships with you all, and welcome any views you may have regarding all aspects of your child's school life.


